Generalised Fisheries Management Procedure

Components of a management procedure of a harvest strategy

- The procedure is a pre-agreed framework for evidence based decisions to achieve an objective
- 2. Management objectives (sets out a vision)
 - What are the <u>goals</u> and the time lines
 - What will lead to a management decision (harvest rule)
 - What are we measuring to evaluate whether the goals are being achieved (performance indicator)
- 3. Harvest control rules
 - 1. Pre-agreed rules that are acted on when the performance <u>indicator</u> of <u>stock status</u> is


at a particular (pre-agreed) level or reference point

- IF the <u>indicator</u> changes by X we will do Y
- 2. Stock status can be model based or be a simple indicator (CPUE).

What does that mean for our discussions

- 1. Is this a one off meeting or is it a dynamic ongoing process
- 2. What would you like the fishery to look like in 10-15 years time
- 3. Can you agree what the performance indicator will be?
- 4. If you agree the indicator then can you agree the point(s) at which new management decisions will be made?
- 5. What management decisions (harvest control rules) should be used to drive the fishery on a path that will achieve the objective (according to your 10-15 year vision)
- 6. How do you know now whether these rules will be effective or not?

You can integrate all decisions into a single Harvest Strategy but you have to negotiate and agree each element of the strategy.
